Coming Up in June:

Dementia Friends talk: a number of people have asked or shown interest in attending a Dementia Friends talk. We have located a contact who is willing to come and talk to us about the awareness of the impact of dementia on people attending church and will give us some knowledge that will help us support those with dementia better. There will be **No Café Church at St Thomas' on Wednesday 27th June** (this is due to the school production). **School Form Consultation:** The PCC are reviewing the way we record and store attendance for school admissions data. One proposal is that rather than sign a list each Sunday, we provide parents / carers with a form for each child that it would be their responsibility to keep. At the end of the service [any Sunday or midweek service or Café Church worship] we would stamp it to show attendance. This form could be used at any church in the parish and would allow parents / carers to hold their own accessible records. The churches would no longer keep any records going forwards.

There will be some example forms available to look at – please let us know what you think whether good or bad. We simply wish to provide a transparent system which works well for us all.

The Collect:

God our saviour, look on this wounded world in pity and in power; hold us fast to your promises of peace won for us by your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

First Reading: Ezekiel 17.22 - end ²²Thus says the Lord God: I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out. I will break off a tender one from the topmost of its young twigs; I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain. ²³On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it, in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. ²⁴All the trees of the field shall know that I am the LORD. I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree; I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I the LORD have spoken; I will accomplish it.

New Testament Reading:

2 Corinthians 5. 6 - 10, 14 - 17

Brothers and sisters, 6we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord -⁷for we walk by faith, not by sight. 8Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. ¹⁰For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.

¹⁴The love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all: therefore all have died. ¹⁵And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. ¹⁶From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. ¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

The Gospel

Mark 4. 26 - 34

Such a large crowd gathered around Jesus that he got into a boat and began to teach them using many parables. ²⁶ lesus said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, ²⁷and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. ²⁸The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. ²⁹But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.' 30Jesus also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³²yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.' ³³With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; ³⁴he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.

O God, whose beauty is beyond our imagining and whose power we cannot comprehend: show us your glory as far as we can grasp it, and shield us from knowing more than we can bear until we may look upon you without fear; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen
